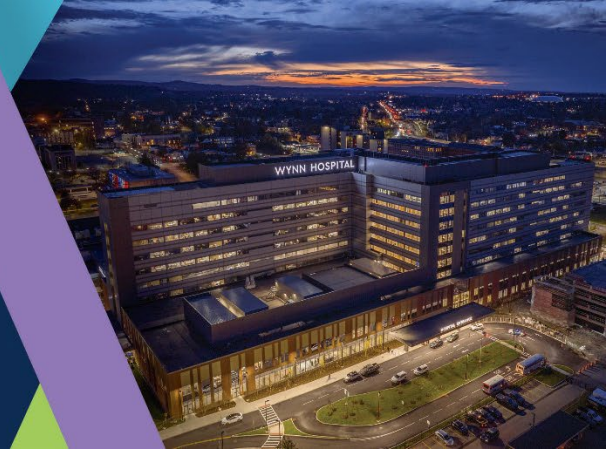

Wynn Hospital Sammon Family Birthing Center and NICU

Our Sammon Family Birthing Center at Wynn Hospital offers pregnant women and their families all the necessary services needed, including labor and delivery, a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), postpartum care, breastfeeding classes and pediatric services.

Here's some interesting facts about the Wynn Hospital Sammon Family Birthing Center and NICU:

- Welcoming more than 1,300 newborns every year, our Maternal Child Services team is there for our patients from pregnancy to postpartum and beyond. Take a [virtual tour of the Sammon Family Birthing Center!](#)
- MVHS has the only Level II NICU in our area, which means babies are able to stay close to home and their families while they become strong enough to go home.
 - The NICU is able to care for patients from 30 weeks up to full term gestation.

 - Children's Miracle Network Hospitals at MVHS helps fund equipment and services in the NICU.
- The Wynn Hospital also has a Pediatric Unit, which takes care of patients from newborn to 18 years of age.
- In July, we had a record-breaking 25 babies delivered in a 48-hour period at Wynn Hospital – including a set of triplets and a set of twins!
 - Update – the triplets were discharged early last week after seven weeks in the NICU. Congratulations to all who helped with their delivery, care and growth while at Wynn Hospital's NICU.





- MVHS also has an OB/GYN Residency Program that enhances coverage within the health system and in the Sammon Family Birthing Center. This four-year program has been granted accreditation status for 16 residents in total (four per year).
- Breastfeeding Services, Classes and Support
 - Maternal Child Services at MVHS offers FREE monthly breastfeeding classes for expectant parents who have chosen or are considering breastfeeding. The classes are held the first Monday of the month.
 - The classes are taught by International Board Certified Breastfeeding Consultants (IBCLC) and cover everything from natural newborn behavior and what to expect the first few days to finding support after discharge from the hospital and help with tips for returning to work.
 - We also offer The Breastfeeding Cafe - a meeting space for pregnant and breastfeeding moms to support one another, socialize and get breastfeeding clinical support if needed. Refreshments are served and a baby weigh station is available. They meet the first and third Tuesday of the month.
